

 Billionaire James Packer stepped down as director of the Crown Resorts

 China began merging its state media platforms into a single propaganda machine, the Voice of China. With a combined staff of 14,000, it'll be one of the world's largest broadcasters.

Alibaba invested another

in Lazada Group, an online shopping mall battling Amazon.com and Shopee in Southeast Asia, The Chinese conglomerate previously spent \$2 billion for an 83 percent stake in the platform.

 Stocks of Apple's Asian suppliers swooned after Bloomberg reported the company has been experimenting on its own touchscreens at a secret factory. Apple is testing MicroLED screens that would allow for slimmer, brighter, and more efficient phones.



Europe

• After months of contentious negotiations, officials worked out a transitional Brexit agreement that keeps the U.K. operating under current EU rules until 2021. Talks on the future trading relationship will begin at the end of March.

Bayer got a green light from European regulators to buy Monsanto for \$62.5 billion after agreeing to sell certain assets to rival BASF.

Bayer and Monsanto must still persuade U.S. regulators, who are pushing the companies to divest more assets.

 South African miners gathered outside government offices in Pretoria to protest diminishing job prospects and declining salaries. The last male northern white rhino, Sudan, died in Kenya, leaving only his daughter and granddaughter in the species.
